

Escorted Small Groups 2011



Are you looking to travel with someone? You are welcome to join the following safaris that I am undertaking personally in 2011. The sign-up lists are now open. Dates will be confirmed when the participant list is complete.

April or May 2011: Botswana: 13 days: I had hoped to go on this reconnaissance safari in 2010 but the year was too busy to fit it in. It is back in the schedule in 2011 and classified high priority.

Destinations include Nxai Pan, Njuga Hills, Central Kalahari Game Reserve, Northern Moremi Game Reserve and the Okavango Delta. This is a mobile camping safari with a family-run operator in Botswana. We will be comfortable but we are keeping it simple at the same time. If March is a better month for you then please let me know. We want to catch the Kalahari at its best. After the first rains, the Kalahari blooms and herds of antelope and wildebeest congregate in the river valleys and vegetated pans where the grass is the sweetest. ***Open to eight participants.***

June 2011: Central Africa: Western lowland gorilla and forest elephants : approximately 12 days: At least once a year I MUST get back to my gorillas in Central Africa. I wish I had time to go more than once a year, but am happy to say that all Congo-bound MTT guests are in excellent hands with Max Bwily who is based in Brazzaville. Come along and see why I love this adventure so much. ***Open to four participants.***

July 2011: Zimbabwe: 12 days: It's back on everyone's radar! That's the buzz in safari circles. I plan to walk it on a fully "backed up" safari – which means comfortable camping – which takes in three parks, Chizarira, Hwange and Zambezi. ***Open to eight participants.***

August 2011: *See More Zambia* on a Northern Zambia Road Trip: 14 days: We will begin in Lusaka and head north to Kundalila Falls, Mutinondo Wilderness, North Luangwa National Park, Shiwa Ngandu estate, and Lake Tanganyika. Depending on how the 2011 rainy season transpires, we may also fit in the Bangweulu Wetlands in the hopes of seeing the Shoebill storks which nest there. Although it is a road trip, there are plenty of opportunities to walk. Mutinondo Wilderness is perfect hiking country; North Luangwa National Park is *the* bush walk destination. After resting on Lake Tanganyika's white sand beaches we return to Kasama by road from where we fly to Lusaka to spare us any backtracking. From Lusaka you can depart for home or continue on to Livingstone and Victoria Falls. As much as I love South Luangwa National Park, Zambia's most popular traveler destination, there is far more to this country. Allow me to show you. ***Open to six participants.***
